In reference to the Mural to be painted within the Village of Jefferson, preliminary discussions had indicated the Mural to be painted on the wall of the Recreation Center. After further discussions with the S.O.C.C. Committee, Mayor, Recreation Director, and myself, we decided to move the Mural to the Police Station wall facing Giddings Park. This will make a better photo and viewing area for the Mural. Other locations and businesses have shown interest in additional Murals in the future, which can be further discussed at that time.

I have been working on the Ohio Department of Natural Resources Nature Works Round 31 and the Recreational Trails Program (Storybook Trail) Applications for grant assistance. I am requesting Council to approve this evening's resolution authorization to submit on an emergency status, due to a June 1st, 2025, application deadline. The purpose of this grant is to obtain additional funds for the Memorial Park Project.

I would like to give a public thank you to Brobst Tree Service for their quick response to an emergency on W. Walnut St. May 5th. During a severe storm, lightning struck a large tree, which created an emergency situation and threat of the tree falling onto a nearby house and power lines. Brobst was on scene within 45 minutes and took down the tree immediately without incident. In addition, thank you to the Jefferson Fire Dept. for arriving and taking control of the scene.

Street Dept.

I have reached out to Verdantas Engineering to get the warranty work completed on the North Spruce St. pavement issues. This work was completed last year and a small stretch of Spruce had issues with the new pavement, which is covered under warranty. I do not anticipate any delays with this being completed.

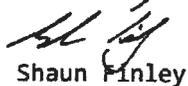

In the Village

The village is moving forward with annual maintenance on trees and stumps. Brobst Tree Service has been contacted to provide the service and would like to have this done within the next 30 days.

The Mayor and I have met with representatives from Verdantas Consultants. We discussed the importance of having a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan completed, which is a pre-requisite to future grants for the village. A grant application for this will be prepared through the Safe Streets and Roads for All Grant Program. Verdantas has worked with the City of Conneaut and City of Geneva in their respective Comprehensive Plans, with each being awarded over \$200,000. We will be applying for the Planning and Demonstration Grant. This grant is needed to establish eligibility for future Implementation Grants through Safe Streets for a variety of projects throughout the village. Comprehensive Safety Action Plans are the basic building block to significantly improve roadway safety and pedestrian travel.

A successful Action Plan includes the following seven key components:

1. Leadership commitment and goal setting
2. Planning Structure
3. Safety Analysis
4. Engagement and collaboration
5. Policy and Process Changes

6. Strategy and project selections
7. Progress and transparency

Action Plans use data analysis to characterize roadway safety problems and strengthen a community's approach through projects and strategies that address the most significant risks.

Street Dept.

The Street Dept. has been very busy with mowing, maintenance on equipment, ditch cleaning, and general maintenance around the village. I want to commend the Street Dept. for their hard work, while working around the inclement weather, to get the downtown ready for the Memorial Day parade. This included gazebo maintenance, sound system testing, and painting of crosswalks and pavement markings. It should be noted; the Street Dept. came in on a Sunday evening to get the roadway painted as they juggled the weather. Their hard work and dedication have not gone unnoticed and is much appreciated.

Safety Town was a success last week and I want to thank Recreation Director Jaime Dean and her staff for making this a tradition in the village. I also want to thank the Jefferson Police Dept. for their professional service and for helping to make this a success.

Wastewater Treatment Plant:

Wastewater Plant has been running smoothly and the employees doing lots of routine maintenance on the grounds.

Other notes:

Sidewalk repairs for 2025 will be beginning soon. Arrangements are in the works to get quotes and scheduling the work. I will have updates at the next Council Meeting.

I am requesting the Village Council's approval of an emergency status to purchase a new Case 4WD front loader and backhoe this evening. This purchase was budgeted for this year and the purpose for the emergency status is for the Village getting the \$29,500 trade in value for the old backhoe. The longer we keep it in our possession, the value reduces significantly. In addition, the risk of something breaking on the current backhoe would also significantly alter the trade-in value. The new piece of equipment cost \$138,751.04. With the trade in, the balance comes to \$109,251.04. This is the most widely used piece of equipment the village uses and is valuable to the Street Dept's. everyday work.

Lastly, On Tuesday, May 20th, the Jefferson Area Chamber of Commerce held its annual awards banquet. Among the evening's recognitions was the presentation of the Chuck Lewis Lifetime Achievement Award. This year's honored recipient was Roni Guerini, who faithfully served as the Administrative Assistant at Village Hall for the past 27 years.

Roni is an invaluable member of our community and an essential part of the daily operations at Village Hall. She consistently goes above and beyond in her role, and her hard work, dedication, and contributions to the Village of Jefferson are deeply appreciated and highly valued. Both the Mayor and I are sincerely grateful for Roni's unwavering commitment to our village and its residents.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Ohio Revised Code §5705.03(B), upon receipt of a certified copy of a resolution by the Council of the Village of Jefferson declaring the necessity of the tax under Revised Code §5705.03(B)(1), a County Auditor's certification, and a certified copy of a resolution by the Council of the Village of Jefferson stating that it will proceed with the submission of the question of the tax to the electors, the Board of Elections shall submit the question of the proposed levy to the electors.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF JEFFERSON, ASHTABULA COUNTY, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. This Council determines that the amount of taxes that may be raised within the ten-mill limitation will be insufficient to provide for the necessary requirements and expenses of the Village of Jefferson, Ohio, Ashtabula County, Ohio and that it is necessary to levy a tax in excess of the ten-mill limitation.

SECTION 2. In accordance with Ohio Revised Code Sections 5705.03(B), 5705.19, 5705.191, and 5705.25, the Council finds it necessary and decides to proceed to submit to the electors of the Village of Jefferson, Ashtabula County, Ohio, the question of a renewal levy for the benefit of the Village of Jefferson for the purpose of providing and maintaining fire apparatus, appliances, buildings, or sites therefor, or sources of water supply and materials therefor, or the establishment and maintenance of lines of fire alarm telegraph, or the payment of permanent, part-time or volunteer firefights or firefighting companies to operate same as authorized pursuant to Section 5705.19(I) of the Ohio Revised Code at a rate not exceeding 1.00 mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to \$0.10 for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for five years, commencing in 2026, first due in calendar year 2027 with said tax to be levied upon the entire territory of the Village of Jefferson which is entirely within Ashtabula County, and that the ballot submitted to the electors shall set forth that said levy is a renewal levy of 1.00 mills for the tax years of 2026 to 2030, inclusive.

SECTION 3. The said question is to be submitted to the electors of the Village of Jefferson, Ashtabula County, Ohio, on November 4, 2025, that the said election shall be conducted, canvassed and certified in like manner as regular elections in said Village of

Jefferson, for the election of officials thereof, and shall be submitted in the manner and form provided by Ohio Revised Code Sections 5705.191 and 5705.25.

SECTION 4. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken, and that all deliberations of this Council that resulted in those formal actions, were held in meetings open to the public in compliance with the laws of the State of Ohio.

SECTION 5. The Clerk of the Village of Jefferson, Ashtabula County, Ohio, is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Deputy State Supervisors and Inspectors of Election of Ashtabula County, Ohio, who shall give thirty days' notice of said election in one or more newspapers printed and of general circulation within the Village of Jefferson, Ashtabula County, Ohio, once a week for four consecutive weeks, on the same day of the week, prior to the general election, specifying in said notice the proposed additional rate to be levied, the purpose for which it is to be levied, and the number of years during which said increase is to be in effect, and the time and place of holding the election.

SECTION 6. As provided in Ohio Revised Code Section 5705.19, this Resolution shall go into immediate effect, and no publication of same shall be necessary other than that provided for in the Notice of Election.

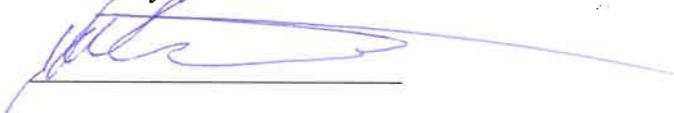

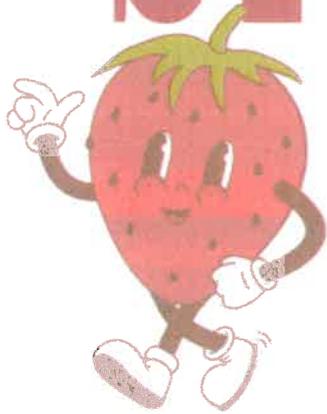

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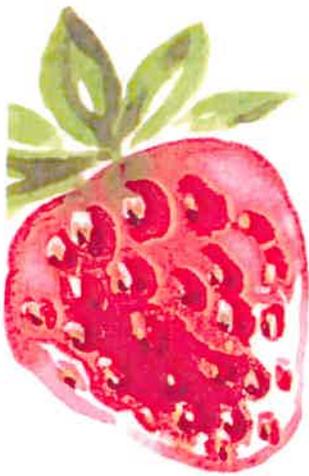


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
